# Summer Greetings Everyone!

Our trail work season started a little earlier this year due to drier weather during May. So far, we haven't had the wet weather and smoke from Canada that we had last summer. The Northern Frontier Section has scheduled a variety of hikes and outings this season and we'll also need help on our work days. I hope you're able to enjoy this season and get out on the trail, on the water, or a bike path!

Last winter, we had intermittent springlike and winter weather conditions throughout the season. The NFS scheduled six snowshoe hikes and four of them were attended. The Whiteheads hosted a potluck/hike at their home with 11 hikers. Two of us hiked up Laraway Mountain (to Laraway Lookout). One of us hiked up Moose Mountain to Willoughby Vista on a very cold day. Seven of us hiked the Canyon Road Trails near Jeffersonville and enjoyed lunch afterward at Martell's Restaurant. Two of our hikes were canceled because of bad weather, however the four hikes we had were fun and enjoyable.

President Ken Whitehead called the meeting 4:45 PM. After welcoming everyone, each person introduced themselves. Ken then explained the organization of the GMC and the role volunteers play in maintaining the trails. Last winter our section scheduled 6 hikes, 2 of which were canceled due to weather. A total of 21 people participated in our events.

Ken then said that most trail walk throughs and shelter visits have been completed. Keegan and Ken hiked Rte 242 to Hazen's Notch assessing the trail for improvements. Keegan documented 38 locations that need work including mud holes, relocations and washouts. Keegan will look into funding for these and also possibly schedule some puncheon work to take place in October. Projects on that section may be done by the GMC during the next two years.

The Jay Camp Tent Platform needs to be rebuilt so on June 4th, Bill Haynie, Christian Lakos, Kip Potter, and Ken unloaded materials from two trailers to carry up to the site. Expecting a long day of hauling boards, they were pleasantly surprised that a group of 20 - 25 hikers offered to help out and carry lumber. The group was from The Tyler Place resort in Highgate, VT and they were hiking up Jay Peak that day. In a short time, all the lumber got moved to the tent platform location. A hearty Thank You to them for making a long day a much shorter one! Volunteers Bill and Christian will complete the platform in the next few weeks and we greatly appreciate their work.

Lorne Currier (GMC Volunteer Coordinator) is looking for a new shelter adopter for Shooting Star Shelter. A big thanks to MaryAnne Wood who has been the adopter for at least 6 years! # **GMC Board Report:** Kip Potter

The new office building is under construction. There have been some cost overruns (\$1.5 million versus \$1 million). A new Code of Conduct for GMC members has been developed and is on the website for viewing. There was a deficit of \$34,000 in the 2024 budget which has been resolved by using other funds. The club is trying to save money to make sure this does not happen again. Molly Flanagan is in charge of obtaining land for the club to safeguard our trails. Only a couple of miles are not protected at this point. Ideally there should be a 1,000 corridor on the trails. The side trails are in need of more protection. All trails are posted on the GMC website indicating if they are protected or not.

# More Announcements, etc.

A Game of Logging Chainsaw Course will be offered through the GMC this September 6th - 8th in Johnson, VT. Completion of the course gives a certification to cut blowdowns on the Long Trail system for three years. This certification is required right now on federal land only (the Green Mountain National Forest). Our section of trail crosses state land and the certification is not required for state land now, but may be in the future. That decision is in the works and the GMC has input on it. The cost of the course is \$660 and our section can't afford it at this time. Other courses will be available in the future and perhaps they'll be more affordable or subsidized.

Just a reminder to all volunteers who do work on trails and shelters: Please submit a volunteer work report on the GMC website (greenmountainclub.org) click on Volunteer, then Volunteer Report and just fill in the relevant info for your work trip. A copy of the report will be sent back to you and we'd like you to share it with the trails and shelters officers and myself. It's important that we all know what's being done on the trail. Many many thanks to the volunteers who work on our NFS section. Your hard work is greatly appreciated!
